Introduction

The Minister for Finance has granted a licence to An Post National Lottery Company authorising it to conduct the National Lottery on the Minister's behalf, in accordance with the National Lottery Act 1986.

At Dublin, this 1st day of January, 2009.

PURSUANT to the National Lottery Act 1986.

An Post National Lottery Company,
with the approval of the Minister for Finance,
hereby makes the following rules.

RULES

1. TITLE

These rules are to be read in conjunction with, and are in addition to, the General Rules for the National Lottery.

- (1) These Rules may be referred to as the Lotto 6/45 Game Rules 2009.
- (2) These Rules shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 2009.

2. DEFINITIONS

In these Rules unless the context requires otherwise:

Act means the National Lottery Act 1986.

Advance Play means a facility to play Lotto 6/45 for 2, 4 or more draws in advance with the purchase of one Ticket.

Bonus Number means the number between one and forty-five (inclusive), randomly selected from the remaining thirty-nine numbers immediately after the Winning Numbers have been selected.

Central Computer System means the computer system used to operate On-Line Games.

Company means An Post National Lottery Company.

Contractors mean the National Lottery's On-Line Gaming Facilities Management Contractor (OGFMC) and its sub-contractors.

Draw or Drawing or Lotto Drawing means the process which is used to randomly select a set of Winning Numbers and a Bonus Number for a given Lotto Game.

Exchange Ticket means the Ticket issued by the Terminal when a winning Lotto 6/45 Advance Play Ticket is presented for payment (provided that the Ticket presented is still valid for future draws) and will show the remaining number of Draw(s) and range of Draw dates for which the Ticket remains valid.

Gross Revenue means, in relation to any Lotto Game, the net receipts (i.e. sales less cancellations) from total Ticket sales for that Lotto Game.

Lotto Agent means a person authorised to sell Instant and On-Line Game Tickets at specified location(s) under section 7 of the National Lottery Act 1986.

Lotto Game means a lottery game wherein a Player selects a set of numbers from a larger predetermined set of numbers, or opts for a Quick Pick selection. The game begins at the time Ticket sales for the Game commence and ends with a Drawing or a series of Drawings on a date or dates determined by The National Lottery at the commencement of the Game.

Lotto 6/45 Game means the Lotto Game wherein a Player selects a set of 6 numbers from a set of 45 numbers, or opts for a Quick Pick selection, for a pre-determined Drawing date(s) by use of an On-Line Terminal, as defined in the Lotto 6/45 Game Rules.

The National Lottery means An Post National Lottery Company.

On-Line Game means a Lottery Game in which a Player selects a combination of numbers or symbols, the type of game and the amount of Play, for a pre-determined Drawing date(s) by use of an On-Line Terminal, or opts for a Quick Pick selection. In return for paying the appropriate fee, the Player receives a computer-generated Ticket with the Player's selection, or Quick Pick selection printed on it. The National Lottery will conduct a Drawing(s) to determine the winning combination(s) in accordance with the rules of the specific game played. Each Ticket bearer whose valid Ticket includes a winning combination shall be entitled to a prize if the Ticket is presented at specified Agent locations or at The National Lottery, Abbey Street Lower, Dublin 1 within the specified time period.

Panel means that area of a Playslip which contains forty-five rectangular boxes numbered one to forty-five inclusive.

Pari-mutuel means that each Prize Pool, with the exception of the Prize Pools for the Match 5 + Bonus Number prize category and Match 3 Prize category, will be shared equally among all of the winners in each prize category

Play means the six different numbers from one to forty-five inclusive which are selected and marked by a Player on a Panel and which appear on a Ticket with a designated Panel letter or Quick Pick selection which appear on a Ticket with a designated Panel letter.

Player means a person participating in a Lotto Game.

Playslip means the card supplied by The National Lottery for use in marking a Player's Selection(s).

Prize Fund means 50 per cent of Gross Revenue from a Lotto Game.

Prize Pool for a prize category means the total amount allocated for distribution as prizes for that category for a Lotto Game.

Quick Pick means a Play(s) consisting of six different numbers which, instead of being selected by a Player, is/are selected on a random basis by The National Lottery's computer system.

Reserve Prize Fund means 14.35 per cent of the Prize Fund which may be allocated to any of the prize categories for any Lotto Game.

Terminal means the On-Line computer hardware and software by which a Lotto Agent enters the combination selected by a Player and by which On-Line Tickets are generated and Lotto transactions are entered and processed, or where a Ticket is generated by means of the Quick Pick facility (some Terminals may only offer Quick Pick selections).

Ticket means the Lotto 6/45 Ticket issued by the Terminal to record a Player's Plays, the Game Drawing date(s), the price of the Ticket (determined by the number of Plays) and other information as determined by the National Lottery from time to time.

Ticket Bearer means the person who has possession of the Ticket.

Ticket Owner means the person who has signed the Ticket or has possession of the unsigned Ticket or who is recognised by the company as the owner of the Ticket under Rule 4.19 of the General Rules of the National Lottery.

Winning Numbers means the six numbers between one and forty-five (inclusive) randomly selected at each Drawing and which are used to determine the winning Plays.

3. PLAYER'S OBJECTIVE

The objective of a Player in a Game of Lotto is to correctly select a set of Winning Numbers, or correctly match a Quick Pick selection for the Game entered.

The National Lottery may, in its sole discretion, restrict or prohibit any person or persons from participation or further participation in any Lotto Game if in its view that person or persons is/are playing in a manner deemed to be interfering with other Players' reasonable access to the game.

4. METHOD OF PLAY

(1) Cost of a Play

- (a) A Player must play a minimum of two Play Panels at a total cost of €3.00 (three Euros).

- (b) The cost of each additional Play shall be €1.50 (one Euro and 50 cent).
- (c) The cost of an Advance Play Ticket will be the cost of the Panels selected by the number of Lotto Draws the Player has chosen.

(2) Making a selection for a Game

- (a) On any one Playslip a Player may play a minimum of two and a maximum of the number of Plays included in the Playslip.
- (b) Each Play is made by the Player manually marking 6 numbers in a Panel, each with a vertical line which should not extend beyond the outline of the rectangular box.
- (c) The completed Playslip together with the appropriate amount due should then be submitted to the Lotto Agent. The Lotto Agent will then on the Player's behalf and as his/her Agent pass the Playslip through the Terminal. The Terminal will then issue a Ticket recording each Play marked on the Playslip.
- (d) A Player may by specifying the six numbers required per Play, request the Lotto Agent to manually key in Lotto Plays.
- (e) Where a Player requests Quick Pick Plays, the Lotto Agent (without requiring a Playslip) will, through the Terminal, issue a Ticket which has recorded on it the requested number of Quick Pick Plays, with a minimum of two Plays (some Terminals may only offer Quick Pick selections). Alternatively a Play may be made by the Player manually marking the "Quick Pick" box in respect of any Panel(s) on his/her Playslip.
- (f) Where a Player uses the Advance Play facility he/she will mark his/her selections in the appropriate Panels of the Playslip and mark the appropriate box for 2, 4 or more draws. The Terminal will issue a Ticket which will show the selections made, the number of draws selected and the range of Draw dates for which the Ticket is valid.
- (g) Quick Pick number selections for any given Draw may be duplicated.

(3) Entry into a Game

- (a) Only the Plays recorded by the Central Computer System are valid for participation in the Lotto Game.
- (b) A Playslip has no monetary or prize value and shall not in any circumstances constitute evidence of Ticket purchase or of any Play.
- (c) A Ticket shall be the only valid basis for claiming a prize or prizes.
- (d) The National Lottery shall not in any circumstances be liable to a Player for any acts or omissions by Lotto Agents.
- (e) The National Lottery, its Agents or Contractors shall not be responsible for lost or stolen Tickets.

(4) Cancellation of a Ticket

- (a) Cancellation of a Ticket is the sole and exclusive remedy where there is an error or omission on or in relation to a Ticket.

- (b) A Ticket may only be cancelled if returned to the issuing Terminal for cancellation within two hours of the time it was purchased, and in any event prior to the close of Ticket sales on that day.
- (c) On the cancellation of a Ticket the Player shall be entitled to a refund from the Lotto Agent equal to the price of the Ticket.
- (d) The Lotto Agent shall punch and retain the cancelled Ticket together with the cancellation authorisation.
- (e) Subject to (b) above, a Ticket purchased on the day of a Drawing and eligible for that Drawing may only be cancelled if returned to the issuing Terminal before Ticket sales for the Lotto Game close prior to the Drawing.
- (f) The cancellation facility will not be available where a Ticket contains only Quick Pick selections.
- (g) The National Lottery accepts no responsibility for Tickets cancelled in error, or where the numbers appearing on a Ticket disagree with the numbers on file at the Central Computer System for that Ticket.
- (h) Neither The National Lottery nor its Contractors shall be responsible for Lotto Tickets redeemed by a Lotto Agent in error.

(5) Player responsibility

- (a) It shall be the sole responsibility of the Player to verify that the Plays recorded on the Ticket correspond with those marked on the Playslip or otherwise specified and that the date(s) of Draw(s) printed on the Ticket are as required.
- (b) The National Lottery, its Contractors and Lotto Agents shall not be liable in any circumstances for any errors or omissions in respect of the issue of a Ticket or the information recorded on any Ticket (whether details of Plays, Lotto Game or otherwise whatsoever), or for any other defect in the Ticket.

(6) Sale of Tickets

- (a) No person or business other than a Lotto Agent under contract for the sale of Tickets with The National Lottery may sell Tickets except that nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent a person who may lawfully purchase Tickets from making a gift of Tickets to another.
- (b) Tickets may not be sold at a location other than the location address listed on the Lotto Agent's contract with The National Lottery.
- (c) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit The National Lottery from designating certain of its employees to sell Tickets direct to the public.
- (d) No Lotto Agent may sell a Ticket at a price per Play other than that set down by The National Lottery.
- (e) No Lotto Agent may receive compensation for the sale of Tickets other than that authorised and provided by The National Lottery.
- (f) No Ticket shall be purchased by, and no prize shall be paid to, any director, agent or employee of The National Lottery or any Contractor

or sub-contractor or, if the Contractor or sub-contractor is a company, any director or employee of the Contractor or sub-contractor involved in the operation of On-Line Games for The National Lottery or any other person prohibited by The National Lottery Act 1986.

If such a person becomes the owner of a Ticket it shall not be eligible for any prize. If any prize is awarded, such a prize shall be returnable to The National Lottery.

- (g) No Ticket shall be sold to any person under the age of eighteen years, but this shall not be deemed to prohibit the purchase of a Ticket for the purpose of making a gift by a person eighteen years of age or older to a person less than that age. Any Lotto Agent who knowingly sells or offers to sell a Ticket or share to any person under the age of eighteen years shall be liable to prosecution.
- (h) No Agent may enter into any special agreement with a Player to sell Tickets outside of the normal methods of Play.

5. DRAWINGS AND DIVISION OF PRIZES

(1) Procedure for Drawings

- (a) Drawings shall be conducted at times and places and pursuant to procedures determined by The National Lottery from time to time.

(2) Selection of Winning Numbers

- (a) Drawings shall be made using electro mechanical Drawing equipment or such other equipment as The National Lottery may from time to time determine.
- (b) At each Drawing there shall be randomly selected a set of Winning Numbers and a Bonus Number.
- (c) The Winning Numbers and Bonus Number will be provided to the media for dissemination to the public.
- (d) In the event of any Drawing being declared invalid another Drawing will be conducted to determine the Winning Numbers and Bonus Number.
- (e) In the event that any Drawing is interrupted due to equipment failure or for any other reason, the Drawing will be completed in accordance with The National Lottery's procedures.
- (f) Where there is significant interruption to the provision of a Lotto Game or games the National Lottery reserves the right to defer a Drawing or Drawings until the game(s) is/are restored and Players have a reasonable opportunity to enter into the game or games.

(3) Categories of Prizes and allocation of Prize Pools for each Lotto Game Drawing

Prizes will be allocated within each category, except the Match 5 + Bonus Number and Match 3 prize categories, on a Pari-mutuel basis. A fixed value prize, which may be determined by The National Lottery in advance of each

Lotto Game, will be awarded to each winning entry in the Match 5 + Bonus Number and Match 3 prize categories.

In certain Lotto Game Drawings, prizes may be awarded either on a Pari-mutuel or a fixed prize basis, or both on a Pari-mutuel and fixed prize basis, as determined by the National Lottery and approved by the Minister for Finance.

- (a) The total Prize Fund (50% of Gross Revenue) will be allocated to the Lotto Game Pools taking one game with another.
- (b) The prize categories within each Lotto Game shall be as follows:
 - Jackpot: Plays which correctly match, in any order, the 6 Winning Numbers drawn;
 - Match 5 + Bonus Number: Plays which correctly match, in any order, 5 of the 6 Winning Numbers drawn and also the Bonus Number drawn;
 - Match 5: Plays which correctly match, in any order, 5 of the 6 Winning Numbers drawn;
 - Match 4 + Bonus Number: Plays which correctly match, in any order, 4 of the 6 Winning Numbers drawn and also the Bonus Number drawn;
 - Match 4: Plays which correctly match, in any order, 4 of the 6 Winning Numbers drawn;
 - Match 3 + Bonus Number: Plays which correctly match, in any order, 3 of the 6 Winning Numbers drawn and also the Bonus Number drawn.
 - Match 3: Plays which correctly match, in any order, 3 of the 6 Winning Numbers drawn.
- (c) The Prize Pool for each of the prize categories for each Lotto Drawing shall be comprised as follows:
 - Jackpot: No less than 48% of the Prize Fund together with any Jackpot(s) carried over from previous Lotto Game(s);
 - Match 5 + Bonus Number: Taking one Lotto Game with another, on average 2.46% of the Prize Fund will be utilised to fund this category. In the event that the number of winners in this category exceeds one hundred then €2.5m will be divided among all such winners;
 - Taking one Lotto Game with another, on average;
 - Match 5: No less than 5.60% of Prize Fund;
 - Match 4 + Bonus Number: No less than 1.40% of Prize Fund;
 - Match 4: No less than 8.63% of Prize Fund;
 - Match 3 + Bonus Number: No less than 5.75% of Prize Fund
 - Match 3: Taking one Lotto Game with another, on average 13.81% of the Prize Fund will be utilised to fund this prize category.
- (d) The balance, 14.35%, of the Prize Fund will be added to the Reserve Prize Fund to be utilised for prize seeding and may be allocated to any of the prize categories for any Lotto Game.

(4) Jackpots

If in any Drawing there is no Play which correctly matches the six Winning Numbers, then the Jackpot Prize Pool in that Lotto Game shall be added to the Jackpot Prize Pool in the next Lotto Game.

(5) Reallocation of Prize Pool for prize levels below the Jackpot

Drawings

If in any Drawing there is no Play which correctly matches five of the six Winning Numbers and also the Bonus Number then the Prize Pool for the Match 5 + Bonus Number Prize category shall be added to the Reserve Prize Fund for future allocation as prizes

If in any Drawing there is no Play which correctly matches five of the six Winning Numbers then the Prize Pool for the Match 5 Prize category shall be added to the Prize Pool for the Match 4 + Bonus Number Prize category in that Lotto Game.

If in any Drawing there is no Play which correctly matches four of the six Winning Numbers and also the Bonus Number then the Prize Pool for the Match 4 + Bonus Number Prize category shall be added to the Prize Pool for the Match 4 Prize category in that Lotto Game.

If in any Drawing there is no Play which correctly matches four of the six Winning Numbers then the Prize Pool for Match 4 shall be added to the Prize Pool for the Match 3 + Bonus Number Prize category in that Lotto Game.

If in any Drawing there is no Play which correctly matches three of the six Winning Numbers and also the Bonus Number then the Prize Pool for the Match 3 + Bonus Number Prize category shall be added to the Match 3 Prize category in that Lotto Game.

If in any Drawing there is no Play which correctly matches the Match 3 Prize category then the Prize Pool for the Match 3 Prize category shall be added to the Reserve Prize Fund for future allocation as prizes.

(6) More than one correct Play in a Prize Category

- (a) If in any Lotto Game there is more than one winning Play in any prize category, except for the Match 5 + Bonus Number and Match 3 prize categories the Prize Pool for that category shall be shared equally amongst the winning Plays in the category.
- (b) On a sharing of the prize allocation for any prize category the amounts attributed to each winning Play shall be rounded correct to the nearest one Euro (€1).

(7) No more than one Prize for a Play in any one Drawing

- (a) The holder of a winning Ticket can win in only one prize category per single Play Panel in any one Drawing but shall be paid the highest prize won.

(8) Results

- (a) The results of each Drawing will be displayed by Lotto Agents in their premises as soon as practicable after each Drawing, will be issued to the national media and may also be published in such other manner as The National Lottery may from time to time determine.
- (b) The information displayed and disseminated will be:
 - (i) The Game;
 - (ii) The Winning Numbers and Bonus Number;
 - (iii) The amount payable to each correct Play in each prize category;
 - (iv) Such other information as The National Lottery may from time to time determine.

(9) Determination of Prize Claims

- (a) In all cases, the determination of prize entitlement shall be subject to the Ticket validation requirements set out in Rule 6 of these Rules.
- (b) The surrender of a Ticket to The National Lottery or to a Lotto Agent and the receipt by the bearer of the Ticket of any prize money payable in respect of the Ticket shall be a good discharge to The National Lottery notwithstanding any notice The National Lottery may have of the alleged rights, title, interest or claim of any other person or persons to the prize money.
- (c) Neither The National Lottery nor any Lotto Agent shall be responsible or liable as a result of the payment of a prize to the bearer of any lost or stolen Ticket whether or not advice of the loss or theft has been reported or notified to The National Lottery prior to payment of the prize.

6. PAYMENT OF PRIZES AND TICKET VALIDATION REQUIREMENTS

(1) Payment of Prizes

- (a) Prizes in all prize categories below the Jackpot and the Match 5 + Bonus Number prize may be available for payment on the day following the Drawing.

(2) Ticket Validation Requirements

In addition to any other requirements specified in these Rules, the following requirements shall apply before a Ticket shall be regarded as a valid prize winning Ticket.

- (a) The Ticket must have been issued on behalf of The National Lottery by a Lotto Agent through a Terminal.
- (b) The Ticket must be intact and must not be mutilated, altered, illegible, incomplete or tampered with in any manner.
- (c) The information recorded on the Ticket must correspond with the Central Computer System computer records. Only the Plays recorded by the Central Computer System will participate in the Lotto Game.
- (d) Each number on the Ticket, whether a Play number, or otherwise must be fully legible.
- (e) The Ticket must not be defectively printed or produced in error to an extent that it cannot be processed by The National Lottery or a Lotto Agent.
- (f) The Ticket must not be counterfeit or cancelled.
- (g) The Ticket must not appear on the Central Computer System computer record of cancelled Tickets. The National Lottery accepts no responsibility for Tickets cancelled in error.
- (h) All information appearing on the Ticket must appear in the Central Computer System's computer record of winning Tickets.
- (i) The Ticket must pass all additional confidential validation tests and security criteria established by The National Lottery.
- (j) The National Lottery shall not in any circumstances be liable to a Player for any acts or omissions by Lotto Agents.

(3) Consequences of a Ticket being invalid

- (a) In the event that a Ticket fails to pass any of the criteria set out in Rule 6(2) of these Rules, that Ticket shall be deemed void and ineligible for any prize.
- (b) The National Lottery may solely at its option, replace an invalid Ticket with a Ticket of equivalent sales price for any subsequent Game.
- (c) Liability, if any, of The National Lottery is limited to replacement or refund.

7. CLAIMING A PRIZE

(1) Time Limit on Claims

All prizes must be claimed within 90 days from the date of the Drawing at which the Winning Numbers and Bonus Number were drawn. Any prize not claimed within the 90 day period in the manner specified in these Rules shall be forfeited and the unclaimed prize money shall be allocated to future Lottery Games. In the case of prizes claimed on Advance Play Tickets or

Exchange Tickets the time limit will expire 90 days after the last Draw date for which the Ticket is eligible.

In the case of a prize claimed by mail, the Ticket must be received at The National Lottery, Abbey Street Lower, Dublin 1 within the time limit on claims. All Lotto prizes may be redeemed at National Lottery Headquarters.

(2) Prize Payment – Match 3, Match 3 + Bonus Number, Match 4 and Match 4 + Bonus Number

- (a) Match 3, Match 3 + Bonus Number, Match 4 and Match 4 + Bonus Number prizes may be claimed at any Lotto Agent by presenting the winning Ticket within the time limit on claims.
- (b) The Lotto Agent will retain the winning Ticket and pay the bearer the appropriate prize money, provided all the Ticket validation criteria and other requirements set out in these Rules have been satisfied.
- (c) If a prize is claimed on an Advance Play Ticket or Exchange Ticket which is still valid for future draws an Exchange Ticket will be issued in accordance with the Company's procedures.

(3) Prize Payment - Match 5

- (a) Match 5 prizes may be claimed at any Prize Claim Centre (selected An Post Company Offices) and at any Lotto Agent authorised to pay a Match 5 prize. Individual prizes exceeding €15,000 must be claimed at National Lottery Headquarters.
- (b) The National Lottery Company, Prize Claim Centre (selected An Post Company Office) or Lotto Agent will retain the winning Ticket and pay the bearer the appropriate prize money, provided all the Ticket validation criteria and other requirements set out in these Rules have been satisfied.
- (c) If a prize is claimed on an Advance Play Ticket or Exchange Ticket which is still valid for future draws an Exchange Ticket will be issued in accordance with the Company's procedures.

(4) Prize Payment by mail

- (a) Match 3, Match 3 + Bonus Number, Match 4, Match 4 + Bonus Number and Match 5 prizes may also be claimed, at the claimant's risk, by posting the winning Ticket to The National Lottery, Abbey Street Lower, Dublin 1. The Ticket must be signed on the reverse side and the name and address of the claimant provided.
If a Ticket is presented to The National Lottery that does not have a name appearing on the reverse side of the Ticket, payment will be made to the person whose name appears on the claim form or other correspondence submitted with the Ticket.

- (b) The National Lottery shall pay such claimants by cheque in accordance with The National Lottery's procedures, provided that all the Ticket validation criteria also set out in these Rules have been satisfied.
- (c) In the event that the Ticket does not pass The National Lottery's validation tests, the claim shall be refused and the claimant advised accordingly of the refusal.
- (d) If a prize is paid on an Advance Play Ticket or Exchange Ticket which is still valid for future draws, an Exchange Ticket will be issued to the claimant with his/her prize cheque.

(5) Proof of identity

- (a) The National Lottery for its purposes will recognise only one person as the owner of a Ticket.
- (b) The National Lottery and/or any prize paying Lotto Agent may, in its sole discretion, require proof to its satisfaction of the identity of the bearer of any Ticket, presented for payment or the identity of any person to whom it is intended to pay a prize under Rule 7 of these Rules.
- (c) The National Lottery reserves the right to withhold payment of a prize until it is entirely satisfied as to the validity of any Ticket and the claimant's bona fides.
- (d) No right of any person to a prize won shall be assignable, except that payment of any prize won may be paid to the estate of a deceased prize winner, and except that any person pursuant to an appropriate court order may be paid according to said court order. The National Lottery shall be discharged of all liability upon payment of a prize pursuant to this rule.
- (e) When a signature has been entered on the reverse side of the Ticket, the person whose signature appears there shall be the owner of the Ticket and shall be entitled to any prize payable in respect of the Ticket. Until such time as a signature is placed on the reverse side of a Ticket, a winning Ticket which has been sold shall be owned by the bearer of the Ticket.
- (f) If more than one signature appears on the reverse side of the Ticket, one of those persons whose signature appears thereon must be designated by mutual consent of the Ticket holders to receive payment. This may be done by indicating the name to which payment is to be made by an indication on the claim form and by the signature on the claim form or other appropriate document of all other persons whose signatures appear on the reverse side of the Ticket.
- (g) In the event that there is an inconsistency in the information submitted on the claim form and/or on the winning Ticket, or otherwise in respect of the claim or Ticket, The National Lottery may make an investigation and withhold all winnings which may be due to the Ticket owner until such time as the claimant satisfies The National Lottery that he/she is the proper person to whom the prize should be paid.

(6) Jackpot and Match 5 + Bonus Number prize payment

- (a) Jackpot and Match 5 + Bonus Number prizes are payable by cheque only at The National Lottery, Abbey Street Lower, Dublin 1.
- (b) Jackpot and Match 5 + Bonus Number prizes may be claimed by presenting a winning Ticket within the time limit on claims.
- (c) The National Lottery will retain the winning Ticket and pay the bearer the appropriate prize money by cheque, provided all the Ticket validation criteria and other requirements set out in these Rules have been satisfied.
- (d) If an Advance Play Ticket or Exchange Ticket is a Jackpot or Match 5 + Bonus Number prize winner and is still valid for future draws, an Exchange Ticket will be issued to the Jackpot or Match 5 + Bonus Prize winner, along with the prize cheque.

(7) Payment of prizes to persons under 18 years of age

Whereas a person under 18 years of age may be the owner of a Ticket, payment of all prizes will be made to the parent or legal guardian unless otherwise expressly authorised by The National Lottery.

(8) Criminal Prosecution

Any person who forges, alters, attempts to alter, or presents a forged or altered Ticket with a view to obtaining a prize, or any other person who purchases a Ticket and is not entitled to do so, is liable to criminal prosecution.

8. GENERAL

- (a) The National Lottery's decisions and judgements in respect to the determination of a winning Ticket or of any other dispute arising from the payment or awarding of prizes shall be final and binding upon all Players and any other person or persons concerned for any reason with these matters unless otherwise provided by law and these Rules. In the event that a dispute arises relative to the winning Ticket, a claim form, the payment, or the awarding of any prize, The National Lottery may withhold payment of the prize winnings until a decision has been reached.
- (b) In the event that a dispute between The National Lottery and the Ticket bearer occurs as to whether the Ticket is a winning Ticket, and if the Ticket prize is not paid, The National Lottery may, solely at its option, replace the disputed Ticket with a Ticket of equivalent sales price from any current National Lottery game.
This shall be the sole and exclusive remedy of the bearer of the Ticket (except as otherwise may be provided by Law, Rules, or Regulations).
- (c) The National Lottery may amend, modify, or otherwise change these Rules and upon full compliance with law, said amendments,

modifications or changes shall become as effective and applicable as if part of the original Rules.

- (d) In purchasing a Ticket, the Player agrees to comply with, and abide by, the law of the Republic of Ireland, the General Rules for The National Lottery, these Game Rules and all procedures and instructions established by The National Lottery for the conduct of the game.
- (e) The National Lottery or any authorised Lotto Agent may refuse to sell Tickets to any person without giving reasons.

9. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Neither The National Lottery nor any Lotto Agent shall in any circumstances be liable for any loss, direct or consequential incurred by any Player, any bearer of a Ticket or any other person arising from the participation by any person in any Lotto Game. In particular, but without prejudice to the generality of this rule, neither The National Lottery nor any Lotto Agent shall be liable to any person:

- (i) for the failure of, or damage or destruction to The National Lottery Central Computer System and / or records, or
- (ii) for delays, losses, errors or omissions in or made by the postal or other delivery service or by the banking system, or
- (iii) for any other action or event which prevents or hinders the issue of a valid Ticket.

10. DECISIONS OF NATIONAL LOTTERY BINDING

All decisions of The National Lottery concerning any Lotto Game, including decisions as to the validity of Tickets, the identity of the bearer of any Ticket, the determination of prize winners, the amount and category of prize money, the interpretation, application, meaning and effect of these Rules and The National Lottery's procedures shall be final and binding on all Players, and any other person or persons concerned for any reason with these matters.
