A Aíonna is Lucht Tacaíochta Uasail,

Tá ríméad orm fáiltiú romhaibh chuig bronnadh Gradaim na nDea-Chúiseanna do 2023, ceiliúradh ar éachtaí dochreidte oibritheoirí deonacha, eagraíochtaí agus daoine aonair a d'fhág rian domhain ar ár bpobail.

Bhí an Crannchur Náisiúnta ariamh tiomnaithe chun saol daoine a fheabhsú ar fud ár dtíre.

Soláthraíonn Gradaim na nDea-Chúiseanna ardán chun aibhsiú a dhéanamh ar na tionscnaimh iontacha a bhí indéanta, a bhuíochas le maoiniú ón gCrannchur Náisiúnta. Fágann na tionscnaimh seo a rian ar chroí is ar anam iliomad daoine agus iad ina n-ábhar athruithe chun feabhais, dóchais agus inspioráide.

Le linn 2022 bhí ról lárnach ag ticéid an Chrannchuir Náisiúnta i ngnóthú nach mór €260 milliún, arbh ionann é agus beagnach €5 milliún gach seachtain. Bhí an maoiniú seo lárnach i soláthar seirbhísí agus caitheamh aimsire a thacaíonn lenár bpobail náisiúnta agus áitiúla. An rud a fhágann an éacht seo níos suntasaí fós ná gurbh ionann é agus an dara suim ba mhó a cruinníodh do Dhea-Chúiseanna ó bronnadh an ceadúnas chun an Crannchur Náisiúnta a reáchtáil ar Premier Lotteries i 2014.

Gabhaimid buíochas ó chroí le miondíoltóirí an Chrannchuir Náisiúnta a bhfuil ról riachtanach acu agus a fhágann go bhfuil na Gradaim seo do Dhea-Chúiseanna indéanta. Tá bhur ndúthracht agus bhur rannpháirtíocht sárluachmhar chun freastal ar ár bpobail. Agus sinn ag obair le chéile, tá rian buan á fhágáil againn. Gabhaim buíochas libh as bhur dtacaíocht dílis.

Ba mhaith liom an deis seo a thapú freisin chun aitheantas a thabhairt freisin do buaiteoirí na nGradam do Dhea-Chúiseanna sna blianta atá thart. Eiseamláirí iad ar chumas ghrúpaí deonacha agus ar na héachtaí ar féidir a bhaint amach le beagán cabhrach.

It is a great pleasure to be with you all for this evening's awards celebrations. Tonight's awards celebrate the immense contribution to Irish life made by some of these thousands of Good Causes. Of all of them, just 34 finalists have made it here and I am honoured to be part of the ceremony and to recognise and celebrate your achievements.

Almost 30 cents of every €1 spent on National Lottery games goes back to Good Causes, which has delivered substantial funding for groups and organisations to help improve services over many years.

In 2022, €259.5 million was raised for Good Causes, which equates to on average €4.9 million being raised every week by National Lottery players to support on average 4,500 community groups and voluntary groups around Ireland -4,500 clubs, projects and organisations driven by local heroes doing incredible work across the areas such as heritage, Irish language, youth, rural and community development, arts & culture, health and sport to make life better for people in our communities.

From upgraded playing surfaces, artistic performances and restoration projects to individuals and groups that are enhancing local support services – a wide variety of inspiring and innovative activity is carried out by Good Causes of Ireland. I am proud that my Department is involved with the National Lottery in supporting this.

Following on from the Independent Review of the Distribution and Utilisation of National Lottery funding published by my Department in December 2022, I intend to progress a number of recommendations that will reinforce the sustainability of the National Lottery as a source of funding for good causes into the future.

Finally, I would like you to note that I appreciate what you all do, and the Government appreciates all that you do across many thousands of communities in Ireland, and I would urge you to keep going, keep serving your clubs, towns and communities and keep improving the lives of people right across the country.

Is mór an pléisiúr dom bheith libh uile tráthnóna inniu chun na gradaim a cheiliúradh. Ceiliúradh é bronnadh gradam na hoíche anocht ar an ionchur iontach a rinne cuid de na mílte Dea-Chúiseanna do shaol na hÉireann. Níl ach 34 díobh uile sa chraobh-bhabhta agus is mór an onóir domsa bheith mar chuid den cheiliúradh ar a bhfuil bainte amach agaibh.

Téann beagnach 30c de gach €1 a caitear ar chluichí an Chrannchuir Náisiúnta ar ais do na Dea-Chúiseanna – rud a chuir maoiniú substaintiúil ar fáil do ghrúpaí is d'eagraíochtaí chun cabhrú leo a gcuid seirbhísí a fheabhsú thar na blianta.

I 2022, gnóthaíodh €259.5 milliún do Dhea-Chúiseanna, ar ionann é agus meán-fhigiúr de €4.9 milliún á ghnóthú ag imreoirí an Chrannchuir Náisiúnta gach seachtain chun tacú le meán de 4,500 grúpa deonach agus pobail ar fud na hÉireann − 4,500 club, tionscadal agus eagraíocht dheonach ar fud na hÉireann agus iad á spreagadh ag laochra áitiúla a dhéanann obair dhochreidte i réimsí dála oidhreacht, an Ghaeilge, an óige, forbairt tuaithe agus pobail, na healaíona agus cultúr, cúrsaí sláinte agus spóirt – chun saol níos fearr a chruthú do na daoine inár bpobail.

Tá raon leathan de ghníomhaíocht inspioráideach agus nuálach á chur i bhfeidhm ag Dea-Chúiseanna na hÉireann ó uasghrádú ar dhromchla imeartha, léirsithe ealaíne, tionscadail athchóirithe agus grúpaí atá ag feabhsú seirbhísí tacaíochta áitiúla. Ábhar broid dom go bhfuil mo Roinnse rannpháirteach leis an gCrannchur Náisiúnta chun tacú leis seo.

Ag eascairt as an Athbhreithniú Neamhspleách ar Dháileadh is ar Úsáid mhaoiniú an Chrannchuir Náisiúnta, a d'fhoilsigh mo Roinnse mí na Nollag 2022, tá sé ar intinn agam dul ar aghaidh le roinnt moltaí a thacóidh le hinbhuanaitheacht an Chrannchuir Náisiúnta mar fhoinse maoinithe do dhea-chúiseanna san am atá le teacht.

Ag deireadh thiar, ba mhaith liom go mbeadh a fhios agat gur mór liomsa, agus gur mór leis an Rialtas, gach a ndéanann sibh sna mílte pobal in Éirinn, agus molaim go láidir daoibh leanúint oraibh ag freastal ar bhur gclubanna, bhur mbailte agus bhur bpobail agus bheith ag feabhsú beatha daoine tríd an tír ar fad.

Sligo/Leitrim Home Youth Liaison Service is a dynamic youth organisation established to support young people experiencing difficulties at home or in their communities.




Youth Work Ireland Meath
